



The Daily DubLShot is a quick, approximately 10-minute feature that airs daily and it features “Songs that are so good they got recorded more than one time.” Little Eva and Grand Funk both went to #1 with “Loco-Motion,” the two versions create a juxtaposition sounding great back-to-back. It’s not just about the oldies, it’s about great music! Wings and Gun N’ Roses both recorded “Live and Let Die,” Supertramp and Goo Goo Dolls both did their rendition of “Give a Little Bit,” and Led Zeppelin and Ann Wilson gave their all on their respective tracks of “Immigrant Song.” The program is fun, engaging, entertaining and gives the listener a bit of history on their favorite tunes at the same time. Because there are literally thousands of great covers of original hits, the program is a special short break from your regular programming to add depth to your station. Listeners will love the contrast and the show creates buzz (outside of the speaker).

James Durkee “Durkman” started his radio career when he was born to legendary broadcast syndicator Ray Durkee in 1962. As a teenager he dubbed tapes and handled shipping for his syndicated radio show ‘Sunday at the Memories,’ literally forging his way into radio from a young age. He began his own on-air work at 19 working for KAZY 106.7FM Denver for five years, later working for KBPI 105.9FM Denver for another 5 years. In 1991 he joined Tele-communications Inc. (Comcast) where he developed applications for high-speed internet and the World Wide Web. In 2015 he answered the call to return to broadcasting by starting to archive and digitize the entire collection of ‘Sunday at the Memories’ master tapes from syndication to make the collection available for download on the internet. He marketed the show, and finally returned it to air every Sunday for an encore broadcast on Cruisin’ 950AM, the oldies station in Denver and KZZJ 1450AM in Rugby, North Dakota. In 2016 the Denver broadcast moved to EZ 1430AM. It was during this time that he developed the concept of DubLShots.

The Daily DubLShot currently airs in Alliance, NE on KCOW; as well as WNAU in New Albany, MS. Now is the time to get the Daily DubLShot airing on your station!
